

## **PROCEDURE FOR RECORDING OF VOTES**

**I.** Each elector shall receive the covering letter and Ballot Paper from the Polling Officer after giving his identification by providing any one of the following:

1. Passport.
2. Driving License.
3. Service Identity Cards with photograph issued to employees by Central/State Govt./PSUs/Public Limited Companies.
4. Passbooks with photograph issued by Bank/Post Office.
5. PAN Card.
6. Smart Card issued by RGI under NPR.
7. MNREGA Job Card.
8. Health Insurance Smart Card issued under the scheme of Ministry of Labour.
9. Pension document with photograph.
10. Official identity cards issued to MPs/MLAs/MLCs.
11. Aadhaar Card.

**Note:**

- During the process of identification of voter, the voters will be required to lower the facemask for identification, whenever required.
- Those who would be held guilty for casting bogus votes would be liable to criminal prosecution.
- No physical contact should be done with the documents of identification by the polling party.

**II. USE OF INDELIBLE INK:**

1. Indelible ink be marked on the forefinger of the left hand of every voter for Registered Graduates Constituency. However, if a voter of Registered Graduates Constituency has also to cast his/her vote for one of the following constituencies: -
  - (a) Heads of affiliated Arts Colleges, OR for the constituency of
  - (b) Professors, Associate Professors and Assistant Professors of affiliated Arts Colleges.
2. The indelible ink should again be marked on the little finger of his/her left hand, before issuing the Ballot paper to him/her.
3. Marking should be done with cotton buds, use one side for one voter and other side for different voter, discarding the bud afterwards.
